II. MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD JUNE 3, 2014:

COMMISSIONER SCHWAB MOVED TO APPROVE THE MINUTES AS PRESENTED. COMMISSIONER GUENTHER SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

III. AGENDA ITEMS:

Community Development Director, Jason Gottgetreu stated he would like to get direction from the Commission on what projects they want to pursue. He indicated that grant funding will be provided from the State, and applications will be due in February 2015.

He stated several properties were previously nominated by the Commission to the National Register. He said Staff has received two requests, one from the Gordon House for a porch project and the other project is to purchase the plaques that identify properties listed on U.S. Department of Interior, National Register of Historic Places.

Community Development Director, Jason Gottgetreu said other options could be to conduct an intensive-level survey to identify additional properties as nomination candidates to the National Register of Historic Places, or façade improvements for buildings that are already listed on the National Register.

Commissioner Guenther recalled that the Commission tried to get funding for the Gordon House before, but it did not meet certain criteria. Community Development Director, Jason Gottgetreu said he would look at previous Minutes to see why it did not qualify. The Commission considered which option they should pursue.

The Commission discussed the match-funding grant for the plaques. Community Development

Director, Jason Gottgetreu indicated Staff time could be applied to the match. He said there is \$12,000 the City could apply for. The Commission considered the work that would need to be done to the second level porch of the Gordon House.

After further discussion, there was a consensus of the Commission to purchase plaques for the properties and request funding for renovations at the Gordon House.
