Briefing Log

Date: 12-5-16 (Monday)

0908 AOA MAPD 800 block N. Pershing St.
Covered Mt. Angel PD regarding a domestic disturbance. NFA.

1058 Ordinance Violation Crestview Dr. / Steelhammer Rd. NE
Received a report of a vehicle parked at above location since 11-30-16. I arrived and determined the registered owner. I was able to contact the owner by phone and told him he needed to move the vehicle.

1133 Property 306 S. Water St.
A library employee found a wallet with an ODL and debit card inside the book return. Unable to reach anyone and left a message informing them the wallet was at the PD available for pick up, wallet placed into property at the PD.

1337 Abandoned Vehicle 300 block N. Church St.
We received a report of a vehicle parked at the above location with two flat tires. I arrived and determined the vehicle was parked in the Church lot. I contacted a member of the Church who informed me they were not the ones who called. I contacted the complainant and informed him I could only enforce the ordinance on city streets, alleys, or public property.

2103 Civil 800 block N. Second St.
I spoke with complainant and learned he had asked his girlfriend to hold onto some cash. Complainant had placed the cash in an envelope in her dresser and the cash was intended to be used to pay rent for the home in which both are listed on the lease. Today he found money missing from the envelope. Complainant said she had texted him, today, saying "I'll pay it back". I informed complainant the matter was a civil issue as he had entrusted the cash to her care.

1807 Abandoned Vehicle Phelps St. / Cherry St.
Vehicle was towed per city ordinance as the vehicle was parked on Phelps and tagged two times for abandoned vehicle.

0642 Alarm 1456 Pine St.
Complainant entered the school through an open door at 06:35 hours. As he entered the building the alarm sounded. He called to Silverton PD to report it. I arrived on scene along with the school secretary. She was able to reset the alarm. NFA

0916 Suspicious 100 block Fiske St.
Complainant from Silverton Realty was notified by one of their tenants who reside on Fiske St., there was someone sleeping in a canopy in the driveway for several weeks. I made contact with the person. She admitted to sleeping in her vehicle for the past couple of weeks. She was advised of the City Ordinance. She stated she was leaving today so there wouldn't be any further problems.

1341 Suspicious 342 Fairview St.

Silverton Hospital reported a suspicious male sitting in the parking lot in his RV and was making the hospital staff nervous. An area check of the hospital was done and found the male subject left the area prior to our arrival.

1446 Public 306 S. Water St.

Complainant wanted to ask officers about his options regarding a male subject contacting him by phone and in person. Complainant wanted to inform officers about these recent contacts in case the male does something more serious. Complainant told me he would contact officers if he continues to contact him and his family members. At this time, complainant advised he did not want the male contacted.

1523 Harassment 500 block N. Church St.

Complainant said she is being harassed by a male subject by receiving text messages from him. I called the male and spoke with his wife because he wasn't available due to being at work. I told her to stop texting and not to have any further contact with her. She said she would block her number.

1635 Driving Complainant 918 N. First St.

I responded to Roth's and located silver Kia 4door with some body damage. I met with two males. The complainant told me her followed the Silver Kia on Silverton Road from Salem, OR. He told me he observed the Kia leave the roadway several times and was surprised it did not cause a wreck. As the Kia was coming through town it almost caused a crash at the stop light at "C" Street and N. Water Street.

I met with the other male and asked him how he was doing and if he was injured. He told me he was not injured and declined medical attention. He told me he was coming from a doctor's appointment and had been given new prescriptions. He agreed to park his Kia in the Roth's parking lot and I was able to get him a cab ride back to Salem. I spoke with a manager of Roth's who informed me it was okay to have him leave his car there for the night.

1812 Public/ Theft 200 block Ike Mooney Rd.

Complainant reported his Capitol One credit card he qualified for had not arrived in the mail yet and suspected it was stolen. There was no evidence to suggest the card had been stolen, activated or used. The card was cancelled and a new card with new identifying number was ordered.

1825 Assist Fire 1000 block Oak St.

Complainant called 911 hysterically reporting her home was on fire. Officers and Fire Dept. arrived to find no smoke, flame or odor. After calming, she explained she heard the electrical short (sound) from behind the fridge and all the house lights flickered, then she smelled smoke from the living room. Officers were called away while Fire Department was on scene.

1942 Trespass 900 block Bryan Ct.

I spoke with complainant who told me she tried to help her dad who has been homeless, but has become afraid of him. Today he came in and opened the garage. He tried telling me he had been living in the house for 30 days. Complainant again told me it was at total of about 10 days off and on. She told me she wanted him trespassed from the home. She walked out into the garage and had her tell her dad she did not want to deal with him anymore and wanted him to leave. I

told him if he were to come back he would be arrested for trespass. I then gave complainant my card with this case number for reference. She told me she would be having a third party get the remainder of her dad's clothes so she would not have to deal with him. I told her it was a good idea.

1934 Drug 400 block Ike Mooney Rd.

I spoke to complainant regarding the comings and goings of his stepson and the stepson's girlfriend. He said he started the eviction process, but works all day so he does not have time to go to the court house. Detective advised.

Date: 12-7-16 (Wednesday)

0714 Traffic Assist N. Water St. / Oak St.

Complainant reported she was driving west on Oak Street approaching N. Water Street this morning and saw a blue Ford Ranger pickup rolling backward, unoccupied, through the intersection. The pickup was not locked and she was able to stop it, set the brake, and turn the emergency flashers on. We pushed the pickup into a parking space on the south side of the intersection. I later made contact with the RO after he returned to the vehicle and advised him of the incident. He told me he parked downtown this morning when he went for coffee and normally makes sure he leaves the vehicle in gear with the brake set, but apparently forgot to today.

0733 Trespass 900 block Bryan Ct.

Complainant called in this morning after she heard someone knocking on her door that she suspected was her dad. She admitted she did not actually see him, but could tell by the knocking it was him. She told me she saw a vehicle belonging to her dad's friend that she knows him to borrow and use in front of the house, but it left shortly after she called and she did not see who was in it. She just wanted to document that she had not given her dad permission to return to the house since she was advised by an officer last night that if she let him come back it would negate the trespass. Complainant said she would call again if she saw her dad back on the property.

0936 ATL: Erratic Driver S. Water St.

Complainant told dispatch he was being tailgated by a male driver driving a white Toyota pickup. I checked the area and was UTL. I attempted to make contact with the RO at his residence, but there was no one home.

1253 Found Bike Bruce Pack

Complainant found a blue, grey and black Mongoose BMX men's bike along the railroad tracks behind Bruce Pack and brought the bike to the PD. A found bike incident sheet was completed and the bike was stored in the Property room.

1107 Suspicious Activity 600 block N. Second St.

Complainant reported he was contacted by staff from the school that leases space at the church and they saw three or four juveniles possibly drinking alcohol on the property. When the pastor got to the church, he spoke to two adults that were leaving the location and denied drinking. The pastor said there was a juvenile male with a transient male, but the other juvenile was GOA.

Complainant said he had received too many complaints about the transient male and his frequent visitors to allow him to remain on the property. While I was still on scene, complainant told the transient male he would need to gather his belongings and be off the property by this evening. I told the transient male that if he came back on the property after today, he could be arrested for trespassing. He said he understood.

1357 Property 1100 block Oak St.

Complainant called in and reported he found a bike on Oak St near Church St. I collected the bike and took it Public Works.

1354 Public 600 block N. Second St.

School staff called to report a female who was helping a transient male clean up to vacate the property, was disposing of garbage in the church's garbage can. A verbal argument occurred when the staff member contacted the female and told her to stop. A representative came to the location and agreed to let the transient male dump his garbage in the can. He moved the can over to the transient male's location so he and the female were not going over by the school.

1901 AOA Mt. Angel 500 block Railroad Ave.

We assisted Mt. Angel PD with a domestic disturbance investigation and custody.

1930 Public 306 S. Water St.

Complainant called in regarding questions about his parental agreement. He told me his ex-girlfriend was keeping their son beyond their agreed time frame. I informed him to keep detailed notes regarding dates in which his ex-girlfriend was not following her end of the parental agreement and inform the courts.

2139 Foot Patrol

Downtown foot patrol. Nothing happening.

0029 Suspicious Washington St. / Mill St.

A black Nissan Sentra was seen in neighborhood acting suspiciously and almost hitting pedestrians. A resident found a person sleeping in the vehicle some 40 minutes later. The person was advised not to drive as he did not have a driver's license and was also intoxicated. There was no current evidence he was the driver and intox at the time.

0329 DUII Oak St. / Mill St.

Sergio Vallejo Pacheco was arrested for DUII after seeing him speeding through the Main/Water Street intersection at about 70 mph. I intercepted him at Oak/ Mill Street where he consented to and failed FST's. Later, he provided a .16 BAC. Cite and Release.

0354 MVA 1000 block N. First St.

Complainant reported a male subject had driven his Subaru Wagon into the side of the building at the drive through of McDonald's. Prior to Police arrival the male reportedly left the scene after driving around the building once. We ended up locating him at S. Water St. and Oak Street and conducted a traffic stop. It was determined from talking with the male that he was not impaired, but might be having a medical issue due to his erratic driving and lack of fine motor skills. He was given a courtesy transport back to McDonald's where he exchanged information with complainant. I then gave him a courtesy transport home. McDonald's did not wish to pursue

charges for the hit and run or property damage which was very minor, paint scrapes on the side of the building. There was only minor paint transfer on to the front driver's side bumper on the male's vehicle. No further action was taken.

0527 MVA 700 block McClaine St.

A male subject accidentally left his Dodge truck in gear when he shut it off and went in to TNT Market. Upon starting his truck to leave and head to work his truck lurched forward striking the wooden pillar and Blue Rhino Propane cage of propane tanks. He bent the cage slightly but did not cause damage to the bottles inside. The pillar sustained slight damage and transferred yellow paint on to the front passenger side fender on his truck. There were no injuries and I assisted with the exchange of insurance information. Fire responded to the scene and determined there was no damage to any of the propane bottles. I cleared with no further action taken.

Date: 12-8-16 (Thursday)

1128 Suspicious Vehicle 5100 block Ike Mooney Rd.

I located a light blue Toyota Corolla, which appeared to have crashed and was partially off the road in a ditch. The vehicle was unoccupied and no one was seen in the area. I marked the car with police tape and later contacted the RO, who had a tow company respond and remove the car.

A Salem police officer was out with a car in West Salem that had been left unoccupied with a dog in it for a couple of days. I was asked to attempt to contact the registered owner. I phoned the Salem PD officer and had him speak with the owner's mother, who agreed to go to Salem to get the dog and vehicle.

1721 ATL/DUII Hwy 214 / Hobart Rd. NE

We received a call of a reckless driver now at McDonalds. I developed my own PC and stopped the vehicle. (A) said she consumed only "1 beer", but failed FST's. (A) was taken into custody for DUII and reckless endangering of another (2x) for having her minor children with her. (A) refused the breath test.

We responded to Safeway after the manager reported a female subject was at the location after previously having been trespassed from the store by another employee. Due to only having third-hand information about the original trespass notice, as well as not having an official notice on-file, she simply elected to formally trespass the female from the store.

0103 Area Check Oregon Gardens

The front desk employee saw me drive through and wondered if I was looking for a green Honda Civic that was parked near the lobby with a door ajar. I wasn't but checked on the vehicle after he called in to dispatch. After meeting with the employee we learned it was an employee's vehicle. Vehicle checked ok. NFA taken.

1318 Foot Patrol Downtown

1428 Disturbance 1400 block Elm St.

Complainant reported a verbal argument with her brother regarding his cat. He left the house prior to my arrival. Complainant told me that during the argument, her brother started throwing her stuff around the house. He then went outside and tossed her bicycle over the porch railing, which caused some parts of the bike to break off. Complainant denied any physical contact occurred between them during the argument. Complainant told me she just wanted the incident documented at this time and for me to talk to her brother about his actions.

1043 Burglary 200 block N. Water St.

Officers responded to the business on the report of a cold burglary. Once inside suspect(s) took jewelry and other miscellaneous items.

1047 Criminal Mischief 600 block Washington St.

Complainant reported someone had slashed her vehicles four tires while parked. A neighbor told me, Daniel Bell had threatened to damage any vehicle parked in front of his house a few nights ago. Another neighbor also had his tires slashed while parked in front of Daniel Bell's house a few weeks ago. Daniel Bell said he was mad at the neighbors always parking in front of the house and "took matters into his own hands." He admitted to spitting on the vehicle, but said "Have no comment" about the slashed tires. Daniel Bell was arrested and cited and released for two counts of criminal mischief in the second degree.

1524 Missing person 600 block Lone Oaks Lp.

Complainant reported a named female had walked away from the care home, but she could not follow since she had to stay with the other patients. I located the named female at the Laundry Depot on N. Second St. I gave her a ride back home without incident.

2045 Non Injury MVA S. Water St. / Central St.

Vehicle #1 was traveling SB on Water when she said she was adjusting her radio and ran off the roadway into vehicle #2's van that was parked. Both vehicles had substantial damage and hers was towed from the location. Driver was cited for Careless Driving.

0200 Suspicious Chester St.

Complainant saw a male going car to car with a flashlight, checked area and UTL/GOA
